Despite recent therapeutic advances improving patient outcomes, many patients still face:

1 **FATIGUE**, which effects 50-92% of patients,² remains inadequately managed increasing risk of:



Depression¹

2 **PROLONGED CORTICOSTEROID** use increases their risk of:
